Food for thought!

Most people on hearing about today's Gospel feel some sympathy for Martha. There she is working hard in the service of Jesus, and Jesus declares that Mary has chosen the better part. 'Poor old Martha' would be a fairly common response. Jesus is clearly not opposed in principle to people working hard in his service. Last week's gospel was the parable of the Good Samaritan. The Samaritan was very active on behalf of the injured man by the roadside; Jesus points to him as someone who exemplifies his own compassionate love. Yet, as the book of Ecclesiastes says, there is 'a time for every matter under heaven.' Apparently, Jesus understood that his visit to the home of the two sisters was a time for them to refrain from activity and listen to his word. Jesus had something to say and he wanted the sisters to listen. It was Mary who recognised that this was the kind of hospitality Jesus wanted on this occasion, the hospitality of listing. Rather than the hospitality of activity. Mary was more attuned to what Jesus really wanted than Martha was.

Yes, Jesus wants us to work on his behalf, but he also wants us to listen to him. Wisdom, consists of knowing when it is time to be active and busy in the service of the Lord and when it is time simply to sit and listen to his word.
