Food for thought

Today we hear about Abraham and how he trusted in God to go out and face the unknown on many occasions, simply because God had told him to. Abraham's journey of faith stands as one of the most profound examples of trusting in God. He believed that God's purposes are good even when they are not clear. Like Abraham, if we can be faithful and trust in God in the little tasks and promises, we learn to be faithful in the bigger and more important responsibilities that the Lord entrusts to us. The Gospel reading today begins with such an affectionate reassurance. "Fear not little flock, for it is the Fathers pleasure to give you the Kingdom". God delights in us and wants us to believe that what He has promised will indeed happen! How rich we are! How blest we are! What more could we ask for! Trusting in God is not about having all the answers - it's about resting in the assurance that God does. It's in trusting in Him that peace is found, and when we do that trust becomes more than belief – it becomes a way of life. Learning to trust in God is a journey – often slow, sometimes difficult, but always deeply transforming. It begins with small steps, choosing to believe His promises, even when circumstances say otherwise. The Lord knows best! May we try to choose faith over fear...surrender over control... and hope over doubt.

Praise Him!

This weekend at all Masses there will be the opportunity to sign a petition, organised by CAFOD to ask that unfair and unjust debts be canceled.

This Jubilee year, people across the world are uniting in solidarity to demand action on the debt crisis. Pope Francis said, "More than a question of generosity, this is a matter of justice."

Often, countries have already re-paid their debts once, but due to unscrupulous lenders and extortionate interest rates, they are left paying the original debt many times over.

We need to cancel unfair debts, build better financial systems and implement fairer laws to prevent future debt crises.
