Food for thought!

Faith is often compared to a mustard seed – so small it can slip through your fingers, yet so full of life that once planted, it grows into something far greater than its beginnings. In today's Gospel we hear how the disciples asked the Lord to increase their faith, but Jesus tells them that true faith even as small as a mustard seed is more than sufficient - if we are willing to act on it! God can take something that seems so small and insignificant and transform it into something great. In the end, the mustard seed teaches us that growth is not measured by how impressive faith appears at first, but by the guiet persistence of its unfolding.
